QUICK HITS

United Bowl History: The Arizona Rattlers are in the United Bowl for the third time in franchise history. Arizona is 1-1 overall in the IFL's championship game, previously competing in 2017 and 2019. The Rattlers took 2017 in what was their inaugural IFL season.

Regular Season Review: The Arizona Rattlers and Massachusetts Pirates played each other for the first time back in Worcester on June 13. In that game, quarterback Drew Powell was responsible for six touchdowns (both three in the air and on the ground) and 210 yards of total offense.

Road To The United Bowl: Before Arizona's road loss against the Pirates in Week-13, the Rattlers went through the IFL relatively unscathed with a 7-1 record. Arizona has won seven straight games after that loss, averaging 55.1 points a game, while holding opponents to 37.7 PPG in that span. This includes both playoff games against No. 8 Sioux Falls and No. 5 Duke City this season.

IFL Honors: The Rattlers have received 13 IFL Awards thus far. MVP (Powell), DPOY (Winfrey), COY (Guy), four players selected to the All-IFL 1st Team, five players selected to All-IFL 2nd Team, and one player selected to All-Rookie.

Let Us Stand And Fight, Gents:

The 2021 United Bowl is a collision course between the IFL's top-2 scoring defenses. The Pirates own a league-best 32.3 PPG playoffs. The No. 1 Arizona Ratallowed, while the Rattlers come in second with 37.1 PPG. Massachusetts allowed only 66 TDs all year. Both the Rattlers and Pirates are ball hawks, finishing sec- No. 7 Bismarck Bucks and No. 3 ond and third in INTs (18 and 16).

Points, Points, Points: The Rattlers went 12-1 during the regular Pirates are led by head coach season when leading at halftime. Patrick Pass. Coach Pass is no first. The Rattlers has won nine games when they reach the 50-point mark, Additionally, Arizona's 766 points were second in the league this season.

Playoff Paths: Arizona and Massachusetts enjoyed homefield advantage throughout the tlers defeated the No. 8 Sioux Falls Storm and No. 5 Duke Citv Gladiators in Phoenix as the No. 2 Massachusetts Pirates beat the Frisco Fighters in Worcester.

But You Have Heard Of Us: The Arizona is also 6-1 when it scores stranger to the Bay State, having won three Super Bowls with the Patriots (2002, 2004-05). During the 2021 IFL season, Massachusetts finished with the third-best scoring offense. It averaged 44.3 PPG behind WR Thomas Owens' 24 touchdowns and 61.7 YPG, both second-best among IFL receivers. Pirates QB Alejandro Bennifield led a passing unit that averaged 134.9 YPG with 46 TDs, both third in the league in their respective categories. RB Justin Stockton rushed for 42.5 YPG, a league-third best plus 11 touchdowns on the ground.



RATTLERS COACHING STAFF

Kevin Guy President, Head Coach

The 2021 season will be Kevin Guy's 20th season coaching Indoor/Arena football, and his 12th as the Rattlers Head Coach. Guy also enters his first year as president of the team, after spending 15 seasons as the Rattlers' general manager.

On March 31, 2019, Guy earned his 200th career victory as a head coach as the Rattlers defeated the Sioux Falls Storm, 58-40.

In 2017, Guy led the Rattlers to a 50-41 win over the Sioux Falls Storm in the United Bowl, capturing the Rattlers sixth championship in franchise history.

In 2015, Guy was nominated for the AFL Hall of fame and was inducted into the University of West Alabama Hall of Fame.

In 2014, Guy led one of the AFL's most-storied franchises to its fourth consecutive ArenaBowl appearance and third straight world championship, a 72-32 victory over the Cleveland Gladiators. The Rattlers posted an AFL-record 14 straight victories to start the season, and ended the regular season at 15-3 and going undefeated on their home turf at Ak-Chin Field at US Airways Center.

Guy's offense in 2014 was explosive, scoring 164 touchdowns and averaging a league-leading 63.9 points per game. The Rattlers offense under Guy was led by its opposing pass offense that threw for over 5,000 yards and averaged a staggering 8.4 yards per attempt.

In 2013, Guy led the Rattlers to its third consecutive ArenaBowl appearance and second straight world championship, a 48-39 victory over the Philadelphia Soul. The Rattlers posted a then AFL-record 18 victories (first set by the team in 2011).

Under Guy, Arizona's offense led the league in scoring with 170 touchdowns and averaging 66.8

points per game. The Rattlers also fielded one of the league's most stingy defenses, allowing only 48.1 points per game, second to Philadelphia's 46.6. Guy also saw eight of his players receive All-Arena honors, including two first-teamers.

In 2012, Guy led Arizona to its first ArenaBowl championship in more than a decade. The Rattlers won 16 games, earning back-to-back West Division and National Conference championships. The offense scored 158 touchdowns during the regular season and averaged 62.1 points per game, while the defense forced 45 turnovers and allowed 48.9 points per game.

Guy's 2011 team piled up 160 touchdowns during the regular season, averaging 61.9 points per game. The defense, meanwhile, forced 54 turnovers for a plus-34 turnover ratio – the best in the AFL – while holding opposing teams to 46.4 points per game. While the Rattlers would make their first ArenaBowl appearance since 2004, they would come up short in the final seconds, losing 73-70 to the Jacksonville Sharks.

An arenafootball2 Hall of Fame inductee, Guy has proven to be a consistent winner, owning a .726 winning percentage (122-46) as a head coach. In 2011, he was named NFL Network Coach of the Year.

Guy joined the Rattlers on Aug. 10, 2007. He had been serving as defensive coordinator for the San Jose SaberCats, which had just won ArenaBowl XXI. The Rattlers, meanwhile, were coming off the second-worst record in the league (4-12). Guy immediately went to work. He retained only three players from the 2007 team and began the 2008 season with nine rookies and seven second-year players. Arizona would win four more games over the previous year and host a first-round playoff game against Grand Rapids. Guy finished second in



voting for AFL Coach of the Year, one of only four coaches to receive votes for the award. In 2010, the Rattlers would post their first winning season (10-6) since 2004 and reach the National Conference semifinals, losing 57-49 to the Spokane Shock.

While the AFL reorganized in 2009, Guy continued his duties with the Rattlers and served as a consultant to the general manager and head coach of the Rio Grande Valley Dorados (af2). Guy assisted with all aspects of the organization, including business and football operations. With the help of Guy's advisement, Rio Grande Valley returned to the af2 playoffs after failing to reach the postseason the previous year.

Guy left the af2 with the most wins in the history of the league when he joined the SaberCats in 2005. His 52 victories came in his four seasons, an average of 13 wins per season. He picked up a Coach of the Year award along the way and finished with a .732 winning percentage while leading the Tennessee Valley Vipers (2002-04) and Dorados (2005).

In 2005, Guy led the Texas-based Dorados to a 10-6 regular-season record and a trip to the league's National Conference championship game. The Dorados' last victory that season, a 65-42 decision over Tulsa in the playoffs, lifted him to the top of the league's coaching leaders.

With Tennessee Valley, Guy's teams won 39 of 48 regular-season games and claimed a division title each season. In 2003, the Vipers won their first 14 games and reached the conference championship game. Guy would be named Coach of the Year.

Guy's teams consistently were ranked near the top of all major statistical categories during his tenure as an af2 coach. He had 31 players advance from the af2, with five joining the National Football League. He had 14 players earn All-af2 recognition.

In 2001, Guy became the defensive coordinator for the AFL's Florida Bobcats, where his defense limited opposing teams to fewer than 30 points per game twice and forced 26 turnovers. Florida also averaged six defensive stops per game.

Guy joined the coaching ranks after an AFL playing career that lasted four seasons. He began the 2000 season as the defensive coordinator of the New Jersey Red Dogs. At 26, he was elevated to interim head coach for the last four games. His team was ranked fourth in the AFL in total defense and fifth in pass defense. Over those final four games, the Red Dogs averaged almost 10 more points per game than over the first 10 games.

As a player, Guy spent four seasons with the Minnesota Fighting Pike (1996), the Red Dogs (1997-99) and the Orlando Predators (1999), primarily as a wide receiver and defensive back. He helped the Predators reach ArenaBowl XIII.

Guy attended the University of West Alabama from 1991 to 1995. He was born Dec. 6, 1972, in Birmingham, Alabama.

Did You Know?

- Guy entered the 2021 seson with an .833 winning percentage as an IFL head coach.
- He is 4th all time postseason victories in the AFL with 14.
- Guy is the all-time leader in postseason winning percentage in the AFL with .737.
- Guy is currently the member of two halls of fames: the af2 Hall of Fame and the University of West Alabama Hall of Fame. Guy is also an AFL Hall of Fame Nominee in 2015.


